Holy Communion is the source and summit of both the Mass and the spiritual life. Our union with Christ in heaven is foreshadowed by our union with him here upon Earth in Holy Communion. Therefore, our reception of Holy Communion should be the subject of much thought and preparation. Following are some prayers that will help to put us in the right disposition for receiving well.

Offering at the Beginning of Mass

Eternal Father, I unite myself with the intentions and affections of our Lady of Sorrows on Calvary, and I offer Thee the sacrifice which Thy

beloved Son Jesus made of Himself on the Cross, and now renews on this holy altar:

- To adore Thee and give Thee the honor which is due to Thee, confessing Thy supreme dominion over all things, and the absolute dependence of everything upon Thee, Who art our one and last end.
- To thank Thee for innumerable benefits received.
- To appease Thy justice, inflamed against us by so many sins, and to make satisfaction for them.
- To implore grace and mercy for myself, for all my relatives and friends, for all who have asked me for prayers, for all afflicted and sorrowing, for poor sinners, for all the world, and for the holy souls in purgatory. Amen

Act of Faith and Adoration - Before Communion

MY LORD Jesus Christ, I believe that Thou art truly present in the Blessed Sacrament. I believe that in Holy Communion I shall receive Thy sacred body and Thy precious blood. My faith in Thy real presence in the Holy Eucharist is firmly founded on Thy word, O eternal Truth. My Saviour and my God, with the angels who surround Thy altar-throne, I bow down in humble adoration before Thy Majesty. Amen.

At Communion Time

Jesus, Jesus! Thou hast come to me in the Sacrament of Thy love. Thou art pleased to make my poor heart Thy sanctuary. Welcome Jesus, Welcome! Thou art the God of my heart, and the God who is my portion forever. I praise Thee and bless Thee for Thy goodness and mercy. "Let all Thy works, O Lord, praise Thee, and let Thy saints bless Thee."

Act of Faith and Adoration - After Communion

Receive, O Lord, my most profound homage in union with that of the Angels and the saints. I bow down before Thee, and with all the powers of my soul I adore thee. Thou art the Christ, the Son of the living God.

Act of Love - After Communion

Jesus, I love Thee, because Thou art infinitely good. I love Thee because Thou hast redeemed me by Thy Precious Blood; I love Thee and thank Thee because Thou hast given Thyself to me in the Sacrament of Thy love. Oh, grant that I may love Thee ever more and more. Thou art the Lamb without spot, that takest away the sins of the world. Take away from me whatever is hurtful to me and displeasing to Thee, and give me what Thou knowest to be pleasing to Thee and profitable to me.

These are just some devotions that can be said with great profit before and during Mass. Other excellent prayers after the reception of Communion include the *Anima Christi* of St. Ignatius of Loyola, and the indulgenced *Prayer before a Crucifix*. Commit these and such prayers to memory and recite them devoutly at every Mass!


